It's amazing to think that A Purrfect friend came into being 12 months ago. We are extremely proud of what we have achieved, thanks to so many people. Thank you for your part in our success and long may it last.

Welfare report from Janice:

We have helped a total of 108 cats.

We took in 101 cats.

We found 88 homes for 85 cats (3 cats were returned to us and homed again).

Sadly 4 very sick cats died in care.

We returned 4 cats that were microchipped to their owners.

We currently have 11 cats in care.

### Mr Darcy

Mr Darcy came to Purfect Friend as a stray and is approximately 7 years old. He was found to have slight kidney issues, which is being treated with daily medication. He can also be a bit unsteady on his feet at times due to an old fracture. Because of this he is now on daily pain medication to manage his injury, and is showing great signs of improvement and building up strength in his legs. Despite any pain he is in, he is the sweetest boy who loves a fuss and playing. He is great company, and spends most time snoozing.



He loves looking outside, but due to his mobility issues would need a home with an enclosed garden - as he can't run, and has difficulty jumping. He would be best suited to a pet free and child free, quiet home. Ideally someone who will be home a lot, as he loves company. He also needs someone who will keep up with his medical needs, and work with the vets to monitor his conditions. All medication is just applied straight to his food - so very easy to do and manage. His medication and occasional blood tests can be paid for by A Purrfect Friend providing he attends Withy Grove Vets (PR5 6QR).

#### **Bellatrix**

Bellatrix is a pretty girl. We believe she is an older cat and she likes to sleep and sunbathe! She has been in our care since January and we would love to find her a new home now. As an older lady, Trixie isn't very good on one of her legs, she is a little deaf and is quite noisy at times which may be a sign of dementia. Trixie needs a quiet home to live out her life, preferably with a space in the sun. She is unlikely to venture far. We also think she would like to be an only cat.



#### Felix

Felix is ready for a new home now, he is only just over a year old and already has had two homes. We must try and ensure his third home is his last. He is really friendly and playful but he needs an experienced owner as he can bite if provoked. No young children please.

#### A Purrfect Friend - Financial Review for year to June 2021

At the end of June 2021 A Purrfect Friend completed its first year of fundraising and cat rehomings. A lot has happened in the last 12 months and the Trustees thought you would be interested to know how the year has turned out in financially.

In summary the key results are as follows:-

The income generated in our first year is a great achievement, particularly given the challenges the pandemic has brought, considerably reducing the ability to fundraise from larger events eg shows and fairs. We are very dependent on donations from all our kind supporters as adoption fees do not cover the costs we incur in ensuring the cats are fit and healthy for rehoming. Clealy vets fees are our main expense despite the discounts Withy Grove Vets allow us as a charity.

Hopefully in the next year we will be able to expand our fundraising activities as pandemic restrictions ease. We have applied for full charitable status with the Charity Commission but are still awaiting confirmation from them as they are experiencing high levels of charity applications as a result of the pandemic. Once registered we will apply to HMRC to claim Gift Aid on donations and reclaim VAT on our costs, both of which will help our revenues.

The Trustees would like to thank all our supporters for their generosity and a huge thank you to all our fosterers whose volunteering enables us to rehome so many cats with income we generate.

We look forward to the coming year and helping more cats to find their forever homes.

Our fosterers and other members of the group, in memory of special cats or people, name our pens. Here is one story of how a pen was named: Thank you to Jean Ashurst for telling us about Isobelle.

#### Isobelle

I've always loved cats, but there were various valid reasons why I couldn't have one. From being small, my Mother and I would cross over to the other side of the road to greet and maybe stroke a friendly feline [I still do, to the amazement of non-cat friends]!

The night before my Mother died (quite unexpectedly), she said we'd get a cat, a tabby girl and that I should hand in my notice at School so I'd be there to care for them both!!!! We couldn't decide whether to have a kitten or an older cat. In a moment of definite weakness, my Grandmother had allowed Mum to adopt a tabby girl from a neighbour, but poor Topsy was soon rehomed to Trafford Street Co-op as a Pest Controller!

It took me 2 months searching for a tabby girl, there were lots of boys, greys, blacks and torties, but I had to have a tabby. A friend of a friend helped at a Rescue in St Annes, where there were two 9-week old tabby sisters - Anna and Belle. I went to see them and was told I could have the 'feisty one', Belle. She differed from her sister in that she had a distinctive inverted triangle of cream on her nose. When I rang the Microchip people with her change of address, I was asked to spell her name; thinking of 'isotherm' and 'isohyet', I spelled Isobelle - which really was quite unique for a special girl! She was a one-woman cat - we enjoyed 8 years together, during which Isobelle specialised in hunting mice, defending her territory, basking in the sun, avoiding visitors, allowing only one other feline, Boo Cat, to share her pots of catmint in the garden!! After frequent bouts of sickness, kidney failure was diagnosed and the Vet gave her only a few weeks to live. I cancelled my holiday to the Dutch Bulb Fields and promised her no more visits to the Cattery. But Isobelle was a fighter and we were together for another 3 years before she submitted to the horrid disease.

#### Scanning

For anyone that may be feeding a stray cat (or trying their best not to feed it as you think the cat may have a home), please feel free to get in touch as we have several volunteers who have micro-chip scanners who may be able to come out to scan the cat. Please consider how great it would be to re-unite the cat with its owner, especially if he or she has been missing for weeks, months or even years. Cats cannot tell us where they have been or how they came to be outside your home. I have heard people say the cat has left home for a reason, it has been abandoned, the owners don't deserve the cat, all sorts of supposition. In many cases, we just don't know, but if the cat is chipped, we can get a long way down the line to finding out some history and hopefully re-uniting he or she with their family.
