The income generated this year is up £3,000 compared to the prior year with events this year being particularly successful. We are very dependent on donations from all our kind supporters as adoption fees do not cover the costs we incur in ensuring the cats are fit and healthy for rehoming. Clearly vets fees are by far our main expense despite the discounts Withy Grove Vets allow us as a charity.

He is a gentle boy and should be fine with older children. He is a bit nervous meeting other cats but not aggressive so would probably be ok with another cat in time




Sultan. Stop Press, Sultan has been homed

Felicity

Felicity came into care in March of this year, a beautiful tortie tabby girl who had been a stray for a while. The vets estimated her age to be about 14 and it transpired that the only health issue was that she had hyperthyroidism. Her teeth and all other blood results were very good, but she was grossly underweight.

The vets prescribed Thyromorm to combat her thyroid issues, but sadly, there was no improvement. Each time she went to the vets her weight had gone down. The best option was to remove her thyroid and the operation took place on the 8th June. She was returned to her lovely fosterer Emma.

On the 14th June, Emma found Felicity had passed away in her pen overnight. Emma was understandably devastated as we all were. Felicity had a wonderful personality, she was the sweetest thing, but sadly it was all too much for her.



Rest in Peace little girl.

We like to keep you updated with current feline problems. Here is an article relating to FIV which can be lived with but can be easily prevented with vaccination. Let us know if there is any other item you would like us to feature.

FIV (Feline Immunodeficiency Virus) amd FeLV (Feline Infectious Leukaemia Virus)

Every cat that comes into the care of A Purrfect Friend is health checked by our vets. They are neutered, microchipped, vaccinated and are given flea and worm medication. Their heart, teeth, skin and ears are also checked and treated as necessary. Cats that are suspected to be over 10 years old have a full blood profile done and we also blood test all our cats regardless of age for two retroviruses Feline Immunodeficiency Virus (FIV) and Feline Infectious Leukaemia Virus (FeLV).

Feline Immunodeficiency Virus (FIV) is similar to the human virus HIV. Cats primarily contract the virus through fighting or mating (part of the reason that neutering your cat is essential). Once a cat contracts FIV they have it for the rest of their lives. Infected cats can have many years before they exhibit any symptoms. FIV results in a weakened immune system and infected cats can become repeatedly ill with cat flu, sore gums, skin disease etc., they may also be prone to tumours and lose weight.

There is currently no reliable treatment for FIV. A Purrfect Friend recommends that FIV positive cats are kept indoors and have no contact with FIV negative cats. Unfortunately, there is no current vaccine available for FIV in the UK.

Feline Infectious Leukaemia Virus (FeLV) is a virus that is fatal to cats. It is transmitted through direct contact with the saliva of infected cats. It can also be transmitted from an infected mother to her kittens while they are in the womb or through her milk. Sadly around 80% of cats die within three and a half years of contracting the virus. Symptoms include recurrent infections, enlarged lymph nodes (often cancerous) and anaemia. Many affected cats have to be put to sleep because they have a poor quality of life. It is A Purrfect Friend policy not to rehome cats known to be infected with FeLV.

There is a vaccine available to protect non infected cats from FeLV and A Purrfect Friend would strongly recommend that you speak to your vets about including this with your cats vaccinations.



Scanning

For anyone that may be feeding a stray cat (or trying their best not to feed it as you think the cat may have a home), please feel free to get in touch as we have several volunteers who have micro-chip scanners who may be able to come out to scan the cat. Please consider how great it would be to re-unite the cat with its owner, especially if he or she has been missing for weeks, months or even years. Cats cannot tell us where they have been or how they came to be outside your home. I have heard people say the cat has left home for a reason, it has been abandoned, the owners don't deserve the cat, all sorts of supposition. In many cases, we just don't know, but if the cat is chipped, we can get a long way down the line to finding out some history and hopefully re-uniting he or she with their family.



Pets at home have included A Purrfect Friend on their lifelines scheme. It's huge for us, the scheme is very generous to charities. If you would like or already have nominated a charity for the lifelines scheme, you can now change your affiliation to A Purrfect Friend. To do it, go on the PAH website, select Your lifelines and the option should come up to support a local or a national charity. Click on local. Our charity is listed under the Preston Store, so if your card is registered to any other PAH, for example Capital Centre, please change that to Preston and you will see our charity at the top of the drop down list. It will now make any difference to yourself which your local store is down as, but it will be a huge help to us. We have received our first payment from Pets at Home (£10) which will go towards our next order of food and litter. Thank you.
