Doug



Flossy is a really nice young cat, but definitely not a fan of other cats. long as she is an only cat, she is a very friendly girl. She's only 12-18 months old.





Cats Homed

Since our last update we have homed 11 cats and kittens. The four little rascals (Ivy. Orla, Tiny Ted and Hugo) were born after their Mum Kiwi came into our care following the death of her owner. Kiwi has now also got herself a good home.





Beautiful boy Billy was found

living rough in a shed. Not only had this little man to fend for himself but it was quickly discovered that he had Feline Cerebellar Hypoplasia often termed wobbly cat syndrome. It is a neurological disorder that causes sudden jerky movements, uncoordinated motion and loss of balance. Luckily he quickly found a new home with one of our supporters who has had previous experience with cats affected by this condition



Also homed were two boys both called Charlie. Tabby Charlie came into our care with two other cats after another rescue appealed for help. Charlie was found living in a home with 24 other cats.

Tulip, Smudge (see below) and Sweety Pie were also found new homes.





As the cost of living increases we are being increasingly asked to take in cats whose owners are unable to provide them with the basic essentials they need. Unfortunately, it has also led to a marked decrease in the number of enquiries we are getting from people looking to adopt. Then a few weeks ago I went to scan a stray cat found in Clayton Brook. I was pleased to find it was microchipped! I contacted a stunned but delighted owner to find it had been missing 4 years! Only lived 2 miles away!

Tub came to us some 10 years ago. He's called Tub because we found him on top of our hot tub on a cold winter day when there was snow on the ground.

My wife had just had our first child and was suffering from severe stomach pains and everything that goes with child birth. Now I've been allergic to cats my entire life and would normal ignore them but he presented himself as an opportunity to distract my wife from her pain. I called her and she came to look. It worked! To keep things going I decided to feed him some tuna. After that act he never left! After a few days I could see he was sick and contacted a local charity who put us in contact with a vet.

Tub was micro-chipped but it seemed that his old owner had passed away. The vet kept him for a few days as he was quiet poorly then called us to collect our (??) cat and he advised us he was about 10 years old. I begrudgingly collected him and set him up in the garage.

We live in a rural location and mice and rats are regularly seen. Tub quickly started work and became a one cat pest control unit! It was almost like he was working to thank us for a second chance. He settled in with the whole family and made his spot by the front door where he sits everyday like a little ginger guard dog even to this day.



He changed my mind so much about cats that 6 years ago we took another rescue cat called Simba. He learnt the ropes from the old boy and can be seen regularly patrolling

his patch. We've now had Tub over 10 years making him the ripe old age of 20 so we are now starting the search for a third rescue cat to learn the old boy's wisdom. We consider Tub retired from work and he spends his days taking it easy.

From someone who would have never considered a cat I now see them as faithful friends taking care of business for me. The kids love to pet them and when I get home from work they both come running to welcome me home.

Beck's pen is with Cheryll and her family. They are currently fostering Mia and Lilo who are 8 and 6 respectively. We are looking to home them separately as they are not bonded by any means.

Scanning

For anyone that may be feeding a stray cat (or trying their best not to feed it as you think the cat may have a home), please feel free to get in touch as we have several volunteers who have micro-chip scanners who may be able to come out to scan the cat. Please consider how great it would be to re-unite the cat with its owner, especially if he or she has been missing for weeks, months or even years. Cats cannot tell us where they have been or how they came to be outside your home. I have heard people say the cat has left home for a reason, it has been abandoned, the owners don't deserve the cat, all sorts of supposition. In many cases, we just don't know, but if the cat is chipped, we can get a long way down the line to finding out some history and hopefully re-uniting he or she with their family.



Pets at home have included A Purrfect Friend on their lifelines scheme. It's huge for us, the scheme is very generous to charities. If you would like or already have nominated a charity for the lifelines scheme, you can now change your affiliation to A Purrfect Friend. To do it, go on the PAH website, select Your lifelines and the option should come up to support a local or a national charity. Click on local. Our charity is listed under the Preston Store, so if your card is registered to any other PAH, for example Capital Centre, please change that to Preston and you will see our charity at the top of the drop down list. It will now make any difference to yourself which your local store is down as, but it will be a huge help to us. We have received our first payment from Pets at Home (£10) which will go towards our next order of food and litter. Thank you.

On behalf of all our cats and kittens can we say a huge thank you to everyone who donates to our food collection bins at the Penwortham branches of Tesco and Booths.

They continue to be a lifeline for us. Thank you.
