



Now that all her kittens, Bramble, Elderberry, Rosehip and Hawthorn have been homed, this beautiful girl deserves a good home of her own.






Arya

Smokey – I can't believe it is 3 years since she brought me home – it was a noisy bonfire night, and I let her know I wasn't happy all the way home. I soon got them sorted though after I had been here a few days. Then, after a week of peace and tranquillity, they brought that thing home! Looks can be very deceptive – he looks very angelic but is a pain. He follows me everywhere and tries to copy everything I do. He is a terrible hunter! This picture is evidence of him getting in on anything I do – there I was – soaking up a rare bit of sun on 'my' bench when he comes and plonks himself in front whilst she is trying to take a good picture of me. None of my favourite beds are safe! The humans think it amusing!

I would like to say a big thank you to A Purrfect Friend for my home except when he is around. (although I do enjoy myself teasing the big clown).

If you have adopted from A Purrfect Friend we would love some pictures and any tales of how they have settled in (taken over!!)

In total we have 15 foster spaces.

We have 8 pens, 4 spaces at Myerscough and 3 other fosterers. Shadrack's pen, Pringle's pen, Marybeth and Marybeth 1 are all at Deborah's. Violet is still waiting for a new home, which we find surprising as she is a lovely girl and grey, which would normally prompt a lot of interest. Violet's 4 kittens all have new homes now. Flo has a new home now. George who had a nasty abscess on his head who is now comfortably safe off the streets as winter sets in. Deborah also has Pickle and Cheese, Ruby and Cassie.

Dotty, Pio and Ella and Chunky all have new homes, and Trinity is now looking after Rose. Therefore, we have filled all the pens with Mali, Sirius, Bella, Ozzy, Bunty and Skye.

Gorgeous Jackson has had cystitis (exacerbated by the fireworks) and is still in Alfie's pen at Shirley's. Jess has just gone to her new home and Isabelle's pen was soon filled by Patricia and her litter of 3 week of kittens.

Jackie was fostering Juno, IO, Jupiter and Callisto but they have been homed, so she now has Lianna and Arya.

At the last time of writing, Lucy's pen with Louise was home to a lovely girl called Nala, who promptly gave birth to 2 kittens. Nala and her two kittens (Timon and Pumba) have all been rehomed. Louise is now looking after Doug, a gorgeous ginger Manx boy.

Daisy and Henry have been homed.

Steven's pen with Cheryll had Coco in, but she is now settled in a new home and Cheryll has 5 playful little monkeys (there were 6 but one little girl didn't make it) which were rescued at 3 weeks old from under the seat of a scrap car. Sadly, we haven't been able to trap mum, so the little ones will have to wait until they are 12 weeks-old and they can be blood tested. In the meantime, their foster pen is full of toys which they love to trash it on a daily basis!

Cathy is looking after Tuna and her two kittens, Doughnut and Dazzle and Spangle.

Those of you who so kindly sponsor our pens. As well as having all these cats in care, we have also been trapping. We go through lots of food and litter and all our cats are health checked and have all the treatment they need to give them the best we possibly can before they leave us.

Trap, Neuter and Return

Did you know that as well as our work rehoming stray and abandoned cats, A Purrfect Friend also helps TNR (trap, neuter and return) feral cats? This is a major part of our charities work.

If one stray or abandoned cat gives birth on the streets and the kittens grow up without being neutered in less than twelve months a colony can easily grow to between 20 and 30 cats and will keep growing until either disease or starvation takes its toll. Cats can become fertile as early as 5 months of age.

We are currently trapping at two industrial sites in East Preston. So far this year we have been trapping at 9 different locations and have neutered 76 feral cats and we have other requests for our help currently on a waiting list.

Not only is trapping costly to the charity in monetary terms, it is also time consuming for our trapping team, requiring numerous visits to our trapping sites which are often in remote areas.

Unfortunately, A Purrfect Friend is unable to help with the relocation of our feral friends

Scanning

For anyone that may be feeding a stray cat (or trying their best not to feed it as you think the cat may have a home), please feel free to get in touch as we have several volunteers who have micro-chip scanners who may be able to come out to scan the cat. Please consider how great it would be to re-unite the cat with its owner, especially if he or she has been missing for weeks, months or even years. Cats cannot tell us where they have been or how they came to be outside your home. I have heard people say the cat has left home for a reason, it has been abandoned, the owners don't deserve the cat, all sorts of supposition. In many cases, we just don't know, but if the cat is chipped, we can get a long way down the line to finding out some history and hopefully re-uniting he or she with their family.



Pets at home have included A Purrfect Friend on their lifelines scheme. It's huge for us, the scheme is very generous to charities. If you would like or already have nominated a charity for the lifelines scheme, you can now change your affiliation to A Purrfect Friend. To do it, go on the PAH website, select Your lifelines and the option should come up to support a local or a national charity. Click on local. Our charity is listed under the Preston Store, so if your card is registered to any other PAH, for example Capital Centre, please change that to Preston and you will see our charity at the top of the drop down list. It will now make any difference to yourself which your local store is down as, but it will be a huge help to us. We have received our first payment from Pets at Home (£10) which will go towards our next order of food and litter. Thank you.

On behalf of all our cats and kittens can we say a huge thank you to everyone who donates to our food collection bins at the Penwortham branches of Tesco and Booths.

They continue to be a lifeline for us. Thank you.
